

This international scientific conference will be hosted by the Thuringian Commissioner for the rehabilitation of injustice perpetrated by the Socialist Unity Party in the GDR (Landesbeauftragter des Freistaats Thüringen zur Aufarbeitung der SED-Diktatur) and the Point Alpha Foundation.

It focuses on state-controlled forced migrations and forced internal resettlements in communist Europe, Russia, and the Soviet Union since 1917. Circumstances, historical background, and execution of forced migrations and forced internal resettlements, as well as the consequences for society and the individual will be discussed.

Eastern European bloc countries and the Soviet Union will be compared in depth through various time periods. This comparative approach enables us to disengage from an exclusively national narrative and allows us to interpret forced migrations as a way for communist regimes to consolidate and establish themselves.

At the conference these thoughts will be debated on the basis of several countries. In addition, the terms and definitions will be sharpened. Working language is English.




